Here are some suggestions to get started:

- 1) [Landmark College](#) is on everyone's list. It's designed exclusively for students who learn differently, such as students with dyslexia, ADHD, autism, or executive function challenges. Their strengths-based model gives students the skills for success.
- 2) [Curry College](#) is an accessible, equitable, and inclusive learning and living environment for all students with disabilities. It provides accommodations and services that promote individual growth and self advocacy.
- 3) [Mitchell College](#) has a tailored transition program. It begins with a *process of self-discovery* that enables their team of advisors, mentors, and professors to help your student discover their strengths, interests, and how they learn best.
